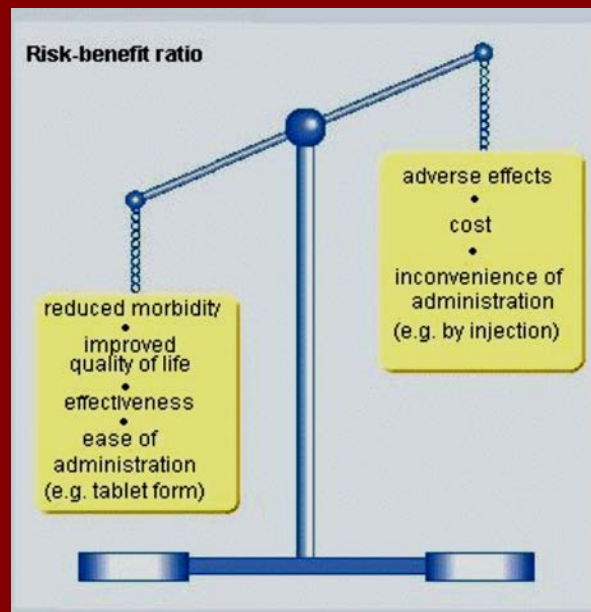


USC School of Pharmacy Offers a Graduate-Level Course:

RSCI 533: Safety Evaluation during Drug Development, 3 units



The Course: Knowledge of product safety plays a critical role in the drug development process. Toxicological evaluation is required to identify potential safety risks that may arise, prior to the widespread use of a drug in humans. Course focuses on safety strategies mandated by regulatory bodies such as the FDA. Such strategies are designed to more quickly take a prospective product from the discovery stage to market approval. Workshops will discuss practical aspects of implementation of safety studies as well as recent disasters including Phase I studies of therapies from TeGenero and Bial that resulted in serious adverse events including **DEATH of participants!**
